



For a transfer at the Airport in Frankfurt intended exclusively to change to an international flight, a permit to carry weapons in the accompanying luggage is not necessary if the transit-area will not be left.

A permit to import weapons is required if an actual entry into the Federal Republic of Germany takes place of an invitation to a hunt or sport-shooting event (but also if temporary the transit-area will be left to reach another flight after having been through customs and passport checks and recheck with the weapon in a separate airline-terminal).

- **HUNTING EQUIPMENT AND TROPHIES**
Each license holder is allowed to carry an additional free baggage allowance of 10KG over and above the normal baggage allowance for the class of service paid. NOTE: The license has to be produced at check-in. Normal excess baggage rates apply if exceeding 10kg.
- **AMMUNITION**
Per license holder and weapon, a maximum of 80 bullets is allowed provided that it's securely transported in a weapon case, allowed as checked luggage only, and the ammunition has to be separated from the rifle.
- **WEAPONS**
A maximum of 2 weapons is allowed (without ammunition) in one case provided each weapon is safely stored and the case is locked.

Note:

If your designated US carrier checks the luggage through to the final destination, it's not necessary to clear customs in Frankfurt, if however your baggage is not checked through, you will receive it in transit and hand it over to a customs official (including your flight details) to transport to your connecting flight. **Passengers must be at least 18 years of age to check in weapons.**

Each country requires a permit to import/export weapons.

Botswana: Permit sourced through outfitter

Namibia: 1 page permit distributed during flight

South Africa: It is advised permit be expedited prior to travel through an outfitter

Zimbabwe: 1 page permit distributed during flight

AIR NAMIBIA EXCESS BAGGAGE CHARGES

Baggage in excess of the free baggage allowance as set out above, shall be charged per Kilogram on SW services as follows:

The excess baggage charges apply to the highest normal direct adult one way economy class fare

* in effect on the date of issuance of the excess baggage ticket

* in the direction of travel

* From the point of which checked baggage allowance is exceeded to the first point at which baggage is collected by the passenger (excluding any transfer points).

The Excess baggage charge per KG is 1.5% of the highest normal direct adult one way economy class (Y) fare, EXCEPT:

Whenever baggage is interlined onto another carrier, baggage in excess of the free baggage allowance must be charged for in accordance with IATA baggage regulations.
